

### Bardsey & East Keswick **Running Club**

#### Couch2-5K - to marathon in 14 months

In January 2023 BEKRC decided to run our first Couch2-5K program, comprising an 8-week course to get non-runners off their sofa, build up their fitness and start running. We didn't know what to expect or even who, if anyone, would turn up for our first session. It was a cold, wet and very dark Tuesday evening. Slowly new faces appeared - one after the other. In the end there were 15 people who were going to take the plunge into running.

Over the eight weeks a couple of people dropped out but by the end, twelve completed our graduation 5K run at Wetherby Parkrun. Most of the twelve still run with us today.

Just after the graduation run in March, in the euphoria of being able to run 5K, and in a sea of messages about the London Marathon ballot, Jenny along with most of the running club signed up. Afterall what are the chances of getting a place. There are only 17,000 ballot places and 800,000 people apply. At least she could say she tried.

Not only did she try but she was the only member of the club to be chosen. Some people apply year after year and never get the chance, but Jenny was lucky, her first ever application and she was in. At least every other member of the club thought she was lucky, to this day I'm still not sure if she found it exciting or the thought filled her with complete dread.

At this stage Jenny had only got to five miles since completing C2-5K. All she needed was another 21.2 miles and she'd be there...!!

Only one percent of the population has ever run a marathon. Whilst 26.2 miles doesn't actually seem that far, at least not in a car, on foot for a club runner, it is. Anywhere between three and five hours of continuous running. By the time marathon day comes along you'll be running up to 60 miles a week, the training takes 16 weeks to get the body conditioned. By the time of the race, you'll have spent almost 200 hours just training for the day. Jenny also works full time and has a young family, so the commitment was huge. Just to run London.

#### April 21, 2024, Race Day

53,000 people set off including Jenny. Friends, family and club members are positioned along the route to cheer her along, glued to the marathon tracker watching her progress. The sun is out, the weather is cool, perfect running conditions, mile after mile she keeps going. A consistent speed! Trusting all of the training she has done. 4hrs 23mins later she crosses the finish line.



Afterwards Jenny said.

"Having moved to Bardsey in November 2022 I thought starting Couch 2-5K with BEKRC would be the perfect way to meet people in the area and keep fit. Never in a million years did I think 14 months later I would be running the London Marathon. BEKRC is a true family, it is an inclusive club for all abilities and ages of runners. If you've ever thought running isn't for you. Think again! Give it a go. You might surprise yourself."

### Bardsey-cum-Rigton **Parish Council Report**

### Cllr. Linda Flockton

#### **Report from Annual Meeting on 15 May**

Election of Chairman & Vice Chairman: The vote was unanimous for Ed Stentiford to continue as Chairman. It was also proposed and unanimously agreed that Dr Mike Bosomworth should continue as Vice Chairman.

#### Shelter/Meeting Place

Cllr Osborne reported that the new shelter/ meeting place will shortly be installed next to the children's playground. We have previously reported that a grant was obtained towards the cost of this shelter from the Emmerdale S106 fund. The table tennis has been dismantled and is to be reinstalled next to the adult fitness equipment in Park Field.

#### **Biodiversity**

Our Biodiversity Policy is soon to be published on the Bardsey village website.

It has been agreed that we will proactively remove invasive species as required under legislation to prevent harm to native species.

The plants which are especially problematic and invasive in parts of Bardsey are, Himalayan Balsam and Armenian Bramble. It would be really worthwhile if we could all attempt to eradicate these plants throughout Bardsey.

It is also good to avoid the use of pesticides and herbicides wherever possible and create spaces in your gardens to enhance wildlife.

The next meetings will be held on Wednesday 19 June and Wednesday 17 July, at 7.00 pm in Bardsey Village Hall Committee Room. The first ten minutes will be set aside to deal with any issues raised by residents.

#### BARDSEY PARISH WALKS

These take place once a year in order to explore the boundaries of our Parish and ensure that the footpaths are well used. The next two will take place on **Saturday 15 June** and **Saturday 29 June**.

The first of these walks will covering the east side of the village and the second the west side. Both will begin at 2.00pm and we will meet at the bottom of Mill Lane.

Both walks will be led by councillor Linda Flockton. Do come along and join us and meet some of your Parish Councillors and make new friends on a pleasant walk, which should take approximately two hours. Boots or strong shoes are recommended. Children and dogs are welcome. However, the walks are not suitable for pushchairs.



### East Keswick **Local History** Group

#### GUIDED VILLAGE WALK - 11 JUNE, 6.30pm

This two hour walk will start from East Keswick Village Hall. Members of the History Group will help you explore the village (which was recorded in the Domesday Survey) and its growth as a rural farming and artisan community. Learn how over half the village became part of the Harewood estate until the 1950s and how the village prospered, as commuters were attracted by the healthy environment and improved transport links.

Despite significant house building from the 1970s a large part of the village is subject to conservation status, meaning that the heart of the village retains many older buildings which illustrate its history.

We will also share stories about some notable residents, including the Moon family who founded a Yorkshire wide grocery empire that thrived for 100 years and the Laurence family who ran two boarding schools. Numbers are limited so please e-mail **ekhistory@gmail.com** to reserve your place.

#### D-DAY ANNIVERSARY

The sixth of June this year sees the 80th anniversary of D-Day. To mark this historic event the History Group have researched the stories of the



five men from the village who were killed whilst serving their country during World War II.

#### News and meeting updates for March and April 2024

#### Neighbourhood Plan (NP)

Cllr Ballmann confirmed that he had now finalised the NP. It was discussed and noted to work back from the election, referendum. It has been submitted to LCC for approval. Cllr Waterfield agreed to find the contact at LCC to progress this.

#### **Memorial Planter & Memorial Plaque**

Cllr Groves confirmed the planter has been constructed opposite The Duke pub. The second planter will now be installed now the commemorative tree has been planted.

#### **Memorial Benches**

It was noted these are now finished and installed.

#### **East Keswick Sports Association**

Cllr Groves noted due to the heavy rain there is no access to the sports field. Cllr

Groves confirmed that Harwood should be able to repair this for an estimated £180 which was agreed.

### Playground Equipment Replacement and Grant Funding

The clerk confirmed the MICE funding of  $\pm 1,483.82$  has been received. It was agreed to go ahead with the quote and noted that the roundabout and climbing frame improvements would be completed by Easter.

#### Verge Creep

This matter has now been resolved, with LCC now having cut back the areas highlighted around the village.

#### **Memorial Trees**

Cllr Harrison will follow up the registration of this war memorial to ensure it is fully registered and recorded.

Parish Council meetings are held on the third Tuesday of every month at 7.30pm, in the Verity Room of the village hall. The next meetings are on **18 June** and **16 July**.

The first ten minutes of all council meetings are set aside for residents to bring any concerns and/or comments to the ClIrs.

On 8 May, we reminisced with Emma Storr, a retired GP, about the type of remedies and foods used over the years to treat both common and uncommon ailments. Often what are now proved dangerous substances were used which may have harmful effects. Certainly we have made great progress in efficacy and regulation. Members shared their own experiences of home remedies and foodstuffs.

A dozen members attended the Annual Meeting of the West Yorkshire Federation of the WI on Tuesday 16 April. The venue, the King's Hall in Ilkley, is an impressive building and was close to capacity. In addition to the normal business of the board, we heard two guest speakers, both passionate about their subjects. Dr Ryad Alsous, BS MA PhD, renowned expert on beekeeping, is leading a community beekeeping project amongst refugees in Huddersfield - "The Buzz Project".

Jane Robinson, author of Hearts and Minds the story of the Great Pilgrimage - told of an inspirational march by very ordinary but courageous women in support of suffragettes. All keen for women to gain the right to vote. Something we now take very much for granted.

Our "Golden Plover" group of local WIs was awarded a certificate to mark 95 years of association, thought to be unique in the



county. This came as a total surprise but was gratefully accepted by Brenda Sanderson.

During the closing item, our own President, Gill Swaby-Ward, was privileged to make the vote of thanks to the Federation Board. highlighting their efforts this year to bring their finances "back-to-black".

We had a perfect sunny day for our coffee morning collaborating alongside Bardsey Gardeners' Plant Sale, on Saturday 11 May. Bacon sandwiches were popular for the early starters. In a busy month of village fundraising activities, we are delighted to have raised £700 which will be shared between the ongoing Turkey Earthquake and Ukraine humanitarian DEC appeals. Our fellow villagers never cease to amaze us with their support and generosity.

Continuing the gardening theme, but looking ahead our **10 July** speaker is the highly entertaining John Cossham, who is passionate about composting. On 14 August we have another musical theme "Village Voices" for our summer meeting when we entertain our long-standing friends from Harden WI.

On **12 June** our monthly meeting will host Paul Whittaker OBE, an inspirational deaf musician. The competition is "music" open to very wide interpretation. Our members never fail to produce a variety of inventive items.

With climate change a recurrent theme, we have arranged a visit to the "Cross Green" recycling centre on 26 June to learn how the council deals with our waste. Participants should have good mobility - a number of steps are involved.

We are hoping for a warm sunny afternoon on 2 July for the annual Golden Plover garden party, to be held in the garden of Pauline Hills.

We meet in Bardsey Village Hall on the second Wednesday of the month at 7.30pm. Our meetings always allow time for refreshments and an informal chat – an ideal way to meet friends if you are new to the village.

### Eco Chat: **Green Food**

No, not sprouts and cabbage but food that is produced and supplied in sustainable ways, creating the minimum of carbon emissions, from 'farm to fork'.

Food plays an important part in our modern day lives and has become one of the most popular topics on our televisions and bookshelves. From buttery baking delights and stuffed crust pizza, to a growing range of ready-meal options, we are spoilt for choice, helping to make the food and drink industry the UK's largest manufacturing sector, contributing £28.2bn to the economy annually and employing 400,000 people.

Unfortunately, our eating habits and the way we shop also now mean that food is playing a major part in the global climate crisis that we face, being responsible for a quarter of all greenhouse gas emissions globally.

Today a huge variety of food is made available to us from around the world, to cater for our modern tastes and lifestyle, regardless of the time of year, leading to increased emissions from the airmiles and intensive farming practices needed to meet demand. Whether its strawberries in February from hot houses in Kent, or chocolate bars from the devastated rainforests of Brazil, our eating habits are supporting economies that are fuelling climate change.

It is becoming clear that there are certain foods that we need to eat less of, such as meat and dairy, and those we need to eat more of, like plant-based sources of protein, such as tofu, beans, peas, and nuts, which have a very low carbon footprint.

It doesn't mean we all have to become vegan but sometimes it's good to indulge ourselves in a little nostalgia and experience a taste of the past by buying seasonally grown, locally sourced food. A good rule of thumb is to avoid out of season, short shelflife fresh fruits and vegetables like berries, green beans, and asparagus which have probably been airfreighted. If you're not ready to abandon meat completely, simply switching beef for pork reduces a meal's impact by six times!

Information on food miles and ways to calculate your food carbon footprint is now widely available, allowing you to look at the carbon impact of individual foods. So, take control of the thing you have the most influence over – what you eat - and help to focus your response to the climate crisis.
